POPULATION

Approximately 135,000 people live in the Saint John Region, and 810,000 in New Brunswick, Canada's only officially bilingual province.

SPORTS VENUES IN THE SAINT JOHN REGION

CANADA GAMES AQUATIC CENTRE

The Canada Games Aquatic Centre, located in the city centre, is connected to many amenities via an "inside conenction" pedway system. The facility plays host to major aquatic sports events, recently hosting the Mainse State Swim Championship & Atlantic Cup. The pool facility includes a 50m eight-lane pool and diving complex, 2 x 25m warm water leisure pools, a tots pool facility, as well as on-deck hot tubs, sauna, and steam room.



TD STATION

Recognized as one of Eastern Canada's most popular and successful venues, TD Statin has a capacity of 6,300.

Centrally located in the region's uptown core, TD Station is connected to many amenities via an "inside connection" pedway system.

Recently hosting and hoisting the 2022 Memorial Cup championships, TD Station is also home to the Saint John Sea Dogs of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League.



IRVING OIL FIELD HOUSE

The Irving Oil Field House is home to a 200-meter, 6-lane indoor Track, a long jump pit, high jump, shot put, and pole vault. The facility also has two indoor turf fields that are each 92×172 feet with 8 team change rooms.

The turf is suitable for a wide variety of sports, such as scoeer, alwn bowling, football, rugby, ultimate Frisbee, softball or baseball land training, cheerleading, ball hockey, lacrosse, and field hockey.



CANADA GAMES STADIUM & UNB ATHLETIC CENTRE

The Canada Games Stadium ranks among the best facilities in Atlantic Canada and plays host to numerous sports including soccer, football, rugby, field hockey, and lacrosse. It is also a premier hosting site for local, regional, national, and international track & field events. The Stadium has a seating capacity of 5,000.

UNB's G. Forbes Elliot Athletic Centre features a 30,000 sq. foot surface with an all-purpose synthetic floor. It includes space for four basketball courts, four tennis courts, four volleyball courts, six badminton courts, and a four-lane running track.



QPLEX

Equipped with an NHL regulation-size rink, the qplex offers an accessible viewing, and capacity for 1,500 people.

A short 20-minute drive from the city's core, the qplex has a history of hockey success, with experience hosting four marquee events: the 2016 TELUS Cup, the 2018 World U17 Hockey Challenge, a 2023 World Junior Championship Pre-Tournament Matchup, and the 2023 Para Hockey Cup.
